I know some folks who are Christians, they know the Lord Jesus, walk with Him, read His Word, and will still vote for a godless, candidate with immoral platform ideas because they are loyal to a party. Listen up Jesus people, if you claim to belong to the Lord, then your vote belongs to Him as well. Think about it. If you are voting for a candidate based on party and that candidate's platform goes against God's values, I venture to say
